2024/06 **District Councillor's Rachel Eburne's Annual Report**

The result of the May 2023 elections was that the 24 elected Green Party councillors officially became the administration at Mid Suffolk; the Council launched the Cosy Homes scheme, a £2 million project to insulate homes for free. Separately, a grant of nearly £1 million was received for retrofitting council homes; a new Pride in your Place grant was established to provide every parish with additional funds to improve the environment for their community; many groups have been supported with the locality fund from Mid Suffolk which for this year was a total of £7,350 for each Councillor for the Haughley, Stowupland & Wetherden Ward. The following organisations and projects in Wetherden gained support, Townlands Trust (for the car park), Village Hall, Parish Council (for the pavilion).

Planning applications validated since the last meeting 2024/10

There have been no planning applications submitted since the last meeting. The Planning appeal for the erection of 2No. single storey residential dwellings with garages and new vehicular access (following infill of existing swimming pool), The Willows, Park Road, Wetherden, Stowmarket, Suffolk IP14 3J is due to be heard imminently.

2024/11 Speeding data

A volunteer has offered to download the data but delayed at present pending an upgrade to the laptop. With batteries needing regular charging, solar powered devices are to be considered. Cllr Eburne to be approached at a later date for a Locality Budget Grant towards the cost.

2024/12 Website

Still awaiting information from local groups for adding to the website.

Townlands car park resurfacing/Village Hall car park resurfacing 2024/13

The Townlands car park was resurfaced with hardcore before the Mayday Fayre. Cllr Perry has since met with a representative from Highways to discuss having a more substantial surface laid down, including two EV charging points/connections. Furthermore, contact has been made with the SCC team dealing with EV points. Waiting to hear back from both parties.

Forty tons of graded hardcore has now been delivered to the village hall car park, with resurfacing work planned for the Bank Holiday weekend (26 May). A thank you to Tony for his generous contribution to the project.

2024/14 To consider common/playing field/projects and concerns

A small amount of garden waste has been thrown onto the Common - now dealt with.

The contract with Stowmarket Football Club is not being renewed next year. A charity match that was due to be held on the playing field in June has now been rearranged to be played at Haughley.

The playing field has been seeded.

Cllr Perry has spoken with Bevans regarding the drainage ditch behind the industrial part that runs along the back section of the Park View bungalows - cannot be dealt with at present owing to crops being grown.

Whilst work is being undertaken at the car park, Tony to investigate blocked drainage.
